We also announced the 16 scholarship recipients, funded by our Patron, the Hon. Ros Kelly AO, with funding to support broad learning and employment aspirations, including wood working tools, tutoring, laptops, courses, and sporting opportunities. With 83% of past scholarship recipients reporting improved financial stability and all experiencing enhanced confidence, we can't wait to see the impact of this round.

Since I started in the CEO role in August this year, it has been great to connect with so many of the amazing women who call one of our properties home. We have such a wonderful diversity of women with different experiences, ages and talents. I'm looking forward to getting to know more of you.



One of the sites I visited was our South Granville site, where we shared scones and recipes for spinach and other produce from the community garden. I enjoyed meeting our tenants and hearing about their experiences of social housing and the new community they are forming.

As part of the 2020-2026 program to develop social housing for older women, we opened a new property in St Mary's with the help of Homes NSW and TAFE NSW. So far, 71 units have been delivered with 4 more projects in the pipeline creating a total of 106 units. Older women are among the fastest growing

groups of homeless people in NSW, and they deserve housing that is beautiful, well designed, fit for purpose and safe. A place they can call home. Feedback

from the women who viewed the property has been heartwarming. As we wind down for the year, I want to thank our tenants, partners,

supporters, Board and staff for contributing to our impact this year. We housed and supported more than 2000 women and children through our housing and homelessness services. We continued to work hard to grow our property portfolio, empower women and improve the quality of the homelessness and tenancy services we provide.

I want to thank our tenants and clients who participate in our tenant activities and programs and play an important role in creating connected communities.

I also want to thank the Women's Housing Company staff who work tirelessly to help our tenants and clients. I admire their dedication and commitment to supporting women to resolve their homelessness and live in safe and affordable homes.

Pot plants, statues, or other objects must be removed from balcony railings or concrete pillars, as they can easily be displaced by the wind.


